
## **Employee Spotlight**

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



#### My Journey as an HIV Advocate

It's not always a bad thing to put yourself out there! That's actually how I got started becoming an HIV Advocate. I asked to get involved, and as a solution I volunteered at Open Door Clinic. Let me explain. In 2006 I left Cook County and moved to Kane County. I had recently retired due to health issues. I didn't know anyone other than family. When I went to Open Door to switch my services I met Mary Hodges. She had me doing some of everything around the clinic! I eventually ended up going with Mary speaking to people about living with HIV. I was good at speaking to people in an entertaining way.

Eventually I met Perry Maier, our current Executive Director. I guess that he saw something in me. He started sending me to the Advocacy and Policy meetings at the AIDS Foundation of Chicago. That was followed by Board of Directors meetings, Client Advisory Board meetings, Collar Counties Consortia meetings, and other Advocacy related events. I also started attending workshops on Client Advocacy, HIV testing, and wellness care!

Whatever came along that sparked my interest I signed up for ! I met many superstars in the Illinois HIV community. The more people I met the less I felt alone with this disease. There were so many creative, caring, and dedicated people working for our benefit ! I met many of those people at Illinois Advocacy Days for multiple years. I was also blessed enough to be able to do this on the national level at AIDS Watch in Washington DC several times ! Those people in Washington DC were really amazing !

There are many ways for you to get involved, and take an active part in your health and the health of others. You can start by finding out what programs the clinic offers that appeal to you. If you don't see what interests you, ask around. If they don't have an answer, they might know where to find it. If you can't find it, try starting your own group. There are many people waiting to help you advocate for your success.
