This quarter, we would like to spotlight Oueering The Binary Foundation, an organization dedicated to supporting transgender, nonbinary,



and gender nonconforming individuals across Illinois. The foundation collects donations of clothing, accessories, and beauty products for individuals aged 7-80+, providing pop-up closets and donation boxes for the trans/GNC community to shop for free. For others, a "pay what you can" model is used, serving as their primary form of fundraising. Beyond clothing, Queering The Binary hosts private parties, craft and community nights, and educational webinars on gender and sexuality. They also offer end-of-life services, make deliveries, and help create trans closets, fostering inclusion and support throughout the community.

Maintaining Mental Health During the Holiday Season

The holiday season can bring joy but also significant stress, especially for those managing mental health challenges. According to a NAMI study, 64% of people with mental illness feel the holidays worsen their conditions. Stress can trigger symptoms of schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and depression, making it essential to prioritize mental health.

To cope, NAMI suggests:

- Set boundaries and accept your needs
- Practice gratitude and maintain a balanced schedule
- Engage in relaxation techniques and daily exercise
- Prioritize self-care, healthy eating, and sleep

- Avoid alcohol and drugs
- Spend time in nature and volunteer to connect with your community
- Seek support from friends, family, or mental health professionals if overwhelmed

By incorporating these practices, individuals can better manage holiday stress and protect their mental well-being.

National Latinx AIDS Awareness Day

October 15 is National Latinx AIDS Awareness Day (NLAAD). NLAAD was first observed in 2003 by the Hispanic Federation and the Latino Commission on AIDS (LCOA). NLAAD is an opportunity to help address the disproportionate impact of HIV in Hispanic/Latinx communities, promote HIV testing, and stop HIV stigma.

This observance is also a community mobilization effort that helps promote effective ways to prevent, treat, and stop the transmission of HIV among Hispanic/Latinx people.

The NLAAD 2024 campaign


brings together communities, service providers, and organizations providing services to Hispanics/Latinxs throughout the U.S. and territories under one theme: "Start Treatment. Stick to It. Get Better." This year's campaign is directed at the entire community but focused on people who live with HIV. The campaign urges them to choose one of the many treatment options to maintain their health, reach undetectable viral load and do not pass the virus to others (treatment as prevention).

This year, the LCOA is hosting a NLAAD webinar series. The

webinars are open to everyone. The sessions will include time for Q & A's and the recordings will be posted on the NLAAD website. All webinars will provide interpretation in Spanish. 
